Considering that many pupils have competed against students from other schools that are older, our school teams have performed extremely well within the Inter-School Competitions. Events in which we have taken part are:

West Midlands 5s Netball - the girls finished in third place.

6s Football – the Under 14s and the Under 16s finished third.

Rounders – the Under 14s and the Under 16s both finished fourth.

Athletics - Tobias Lee came First in the 100m and 600m, Tyrese Dunkley First in the 100m, Nikita Leadbeatter was second in the 100m as well as a number of third places.

Overall we finished third out of seven schools.

Indoor Athletics - we gained First place.

Finally, Year 11 were entered into five modules at Entry Level for Healthy and Fitness. Every pupil passed these at either Entry Level 2 or 3 and this was a superb effort by all of the pupils involved.



It's been a busy year for our 6th form students. Their new Work Experience Day was spent out of school undertaking a wide range of activities. This year they worked at the Albrighton Moat Project learning skills in horticulture, the environment and fishing, they also visited Wolverhampton Vocational & Technical College as well as Nova training for taster days of plumbing, painting & decorating, carpentry, car maintenance and hair & beauty. They also spent 5 weeks at Stable Relationships, near Telford, where they tried simple grooming and animal care ... and even rode the horses! Five weeks were spent doing outdoor adventure activities which included zip wires, independent map work, abseiling and climbing. Not only have our 6th Formers learned new skills, but their confidence to take on new things has grown tremendously. 


SCIENCE


at Penn Fields School

It has been a busy year in Science with lots of really good progress achieved by all students. Key stage 3 have enjoyed a variety of different themes throughout the year including topics in Biology, concentrating on Living Things such as plants, animals and even humans! In Physical Processes pupils learned about electricity, forces and the solar system.

Materials is one of the favourite topics for many of our students who love to see chemical changes with lots of the exciting stuff using Bunsen burners and mixing chemicals to observe colour changes and chemical reactions.



Upper school pupils have worked extremely hard and did really well again this year to successfully achieve all the units they studied, so well done to everyone!



During the summer term pupils have been helping to maintain our pond environment by removing excessive pond weed and overgrowth.

It has been a very successfully year in science and I congratulate all the pupils and staff for the hard work.

Massive Congratulations to Class 11

After lots and lots of hard work Simaren Atti, Scott Leadbeatter, Ryan Plant, Chad Hay, Mackenzie Carpenter, Adam Banks, Megan Turner, Armani Granville, Brandon Bloomfield, Brandon Taylor and Tyrese Dunkley have managed to complete their DoE Bronze Award. They are only the second group at Penn Fields School to attain this fantastic achievement, having completed three

months of volunteer work, three months using a skill and six months undertaking a sport. The final stage of the Award was to complete their qualifying expedition in May.



Class 10 are continuing to work hard towards their Bronze Duke of Edinburgh's Award, focussing this term on expedition training. They have learned how to put up tents and use a Trangia, or cooking stove, and their first practice expedition went very well.
